Did you Know?

Halide allows you to switch into a manual focus control with the tap of a button. In this mode, you can take advantage of focus peaking, which highlights areas of the highest contrast, so you can tell what's in focus.

Lightroom

Why we love it

Lightroom is a refined, ubiquitous environment for managing your photo library, whether you choose the re-thought cloud-based Lightroom CC, or the more familiar, professional-oriented Lightroom Classic CC. The ability to pass tasks seamlessly between devices, between contexts, and between coworkers is increasingly important. That's why Adobe Lightroom remains our pick for the best photo editing and management application for mainstream users.

Pro Tip for Lightroom Users

With Lightroom CC you can access and edit your RAW files from any device. It also allows you to sync your presets across devices. This feature is not available in Lightroom Classic.

Did you Know?

Unlike iCloud Photo Library, Lightroom CC lets you manage storage very precisely, so you can explicitly choose which albums should be stored locally and which should remain in the cloud until you call them down. This is crucial for phones and tablets, where storage space is often at a premium.

VSCO

Why we love it

One of the most popular tools for editing on the go is an app called VSCO. VSCO is well-known for having some of the best preset filters on the market. The app itself is also a powerful editing environment and even has its own social network. It is simple enough for anyone to use, yet powerful enough to satisfy even the most advanced photo editors.

Pro Tip

For \$20 a year you can access all the new VSCO X presets. Not only do you get access to the new presets, you also get access to their entire back catalog of other presets which you'd otherwise have to buy in packs individually.

Did you Know?

The social network aspect of VSCO allows you to follow other creators. But it also gives you the ability to see what VSCO filter they used to create their image. This can be a fun way to discover new looks filter that you may not have tried.

iCloud Photo Library

Why we love it

By enabling iCloud Photo Library, you can have *all* your photos on *all* of your devices. It makes sharing photos easy with native access to the share sheet. And with the built in Memories feature, it's easy to re-discover treasures from yesteryear.

Pro Tip

We highly recommend upgrading your iCloud storage tier. The default, free tier for iCloud storage is abysmal. And with all the photos — plus device backups and other files — that you can store in iCloud, we believe it's worth the subscription to upgrade your storage. Plus: your additional iCloud storage is also available for those in your Family Sharing group.

Did you Know?

Thanks to the Files app on iOS, you can access files that are on your Mac or on other devices. It's a convenient and reliable way to make sure all your files are available to you no matter what device you're on.

Advanced Mobile Editing

Snapseed

Why we love it

Snapseed is designed around editing one photo at a time and presents some pretty robust tools. The interface is based around different gestures that allows users to easily make fine adjustments with traditional photo editing tools. It also has some unique AI-assisted photo editing algorithms.

Pro Tip

Taking advantage of Google's powerful AI, you can use the "Expand" tool to intelligently expand the photo canvas. Google fills in those new spaces with content that makes sense and looks like it was in the original image.

Did you Know?

Snapseed has a history icon that allows you to revert your image to a previous edit no matter how far down the line you get. If you end up changing your mind about the direction you've taken a photo, you can always go back to a previous version that's more in line with your style.
